



## PE and Sport Premium Wilbarston

### C of E Primary School

#### **What is the PE and Sport Premium for primary schools?**

The government has provided additional funding to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools in England. This is known as the Primary PE & Sport Premium. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but have the freedom to choose how they do this.<sup>1</sup>

#### **What funding has been received by Wilbarston C of E Primary School in 2020**

**Total for 2019/ 2020 is £16,930.**

#### **How has the funding been spent and what has been the impact?**

Action	Actual/Forecasted Cost	Impact
Transport	£383	Transport by coach to allow children to participate in various competitions and events, including: tri golf, athletics, swimming gala, cross country, Year 6 post SATs sports celebration event. This also includes transport for the Year 3,4 and 5 weekly swimming lessons. This has enabled the school to provide more opportunities for pupils to take part in inter-school competitions.

Bikeability	£132	Bikeability is about gaining practical skills and understanding how to cycle on today's roads. This enables children to become safer and more confident to cycle around villages and towns. This programme aims to sustain participation in cycling activity in England having a direct impact on the health of the environment and the child. Year 5 and 6 participated in this programme which was fully funded by PE and sport premium. Pupil evaluation and parental comments were positive about confidence and skills gained.
Cover for PE meetings	£107	This has allowed opportunity for collaborative work on physical education with other schools in the MAT. The PE co-ordinator has attended termly meetings to arrange fixtures, policies, review curriculum delivery and organise new opportunities. This is covered by a higher level teaching assistant.
School clubs	£6449	This has enabled the children to participate in after school and lunch time clubs such as football club, boxercise, athletics and scooter club. This has meant that children have had an opportunity to experience a wide range of sports activities. This is helping to ensure that children are active during break times and after school, giving them skills and motivation to engage in sporting activities. During Pacesetter lunchtimes 100% of pupils are engaged in fun physical activity.
PE equipment/ Trophies	£349	This is for replacing old and outdated equipment. It has also been used to buy new sports resources not previously available such as a bowls set and a curling set. Staff were also able to buy equipment for use during play times and lunch times to encourage children to participate in sporting activities. The impact of this has been to motivate pupils to be more active – 100% of children were active during breaks and lunchtimes through Pacesetters and also in lessons.

Fleeces	£49	Staff were brought new PE sports shirts and fleeces with the school logo on last year. Some extra fleeces needed ordering in different sizes. This was to enable staff to be recognisable and locatable at sporting events.
Kingfishers Trip	£289	This was a bonding trip for year 6 students at the Kingswood centre.
Kettering School Partnership	£200	Northamptonshire Sport is hosted by Northamptonshire County Council and its activities are funded through Sport England Lottery grant and by local and national partners. Kettering sports partnership holds a directory of sports clubs in Northamptonshire, offering a variety of sports and events for children to participate in.
Swimming	£716	This enables children from year 3 to year 6 to be able to swim safely and deal with emergencies when falling into water. Following the course of swimming 95% of Y6 could swim well meeting the 25m standard and being "water safe, all these pupils can use a range of strokes effectively.
